DATE/TIME OF REPORT: October 8, 2019, 2:45 P.M.

- According to a <u>PG&E news release</u> at 2:00 p.m., PG&E confirms it will shut off power to nearly 800,000 customers, including 38,000 in Santa Clara County, due to forecasted high winds and low humidity on Wednesday, October 9 through noon on Thursday, October 10. According to PG&E, the power shutoff could occur between midnight on Wednesday (late Tuesday night) and noon on Wednesday. PG&E has indicated a full power restoration could take up to 5 days.
- PG&E projects parts of east San Jose along the foothills and south San Jose in Almaden Valley (areas that are vulnerable to wildfires) to be affected. To view PG&E's Outage Map and search by address, visit: <u>http://bit.ly/PGE_OutageMap.</u>
- The City of San Jose will hold a press briefing at 4:45 p.m. in the Mayor's Conference Room on the 18th floor of City Hall. The City of San Jose will activate its Emergency Operations Center beginning Tuesday at 10 p.m., and has a Power Vulnerability Plan to prepare for and respond to PG&E Power Shutoffs.

duration of the event. Residents will have access to information, water, charging stations for phones and medical devices, and air conditioning. Sheltering and medical care will not be provided.

- The City of San Jose will open three City Resource Centers at community centers. They will be open starting Wednesday, October 9 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. for the duration of the event. Residents will have access to information, charging stations for phones and plug-in medical devices, water, and light snacks. Spanish and Vietnamese interpretation will be available. Sheltering and medical care will not be provided.
