DATE/TIME OF REPORT: October 9, 2019, 2:20 P.M.

- According to PG&E, power shutoffs in San Jose may begin at approximately 8:00 p.m. today, Wednesday, October 9.
- The City of San Jose has proclaimed a local state of emergency.
- The City of San Jose have dispatched Fire and Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services staff to medical care facilities and medical baseline customers who PG&E has not been able to reach to inform them of the power shutoff.
- The next Media Briefing will be held outside the City of San Jose Police Station located at 201 West Mission St. at 3:15 p.m. today.

- During the PG&E Power Shutoff, avoid leaving your home unless necessary.
- Residents and businesses in the affected areas are asked to conserve water and halt outdoor irrigation.
- PG&E workers are conducting direct outreach to residents in the community. Residents
 are asked to let the workers do their jobs to contact vulnerable residents and
 ensure public safety.
- If you rely on electricity for your medical needs, please be aware of the following:

 - o If you experience a medical emergency, please call 911.

Transportation

The City of San Jose has modified some streets to increase safety during this time. The City has closed off one or more left turn pockets at the following six intersections. The closures will reduce dual left turn lanes to single left turns, making the intersections simpler to use without functioning signals.

- San Felipe/White & Aborn
- Eastridge Bl & Quimby Rd
- San Felipe &Yerba Buena
- Hellyer & Silver Creek Valley Rd
- San Felipe & Villages Parkway
- Alum Rock Av & N Capitol Av

There are signs to warn drivers of crosswalks in the following areas:

- EB Quimby, east of Rigoletto
- EB Tully, east of Glen Angus
- EB Aborn, near Pomeroy
- EB, Yerba Buena, east of Silver Creek Valley Road

Please be cautious while driving and stop at dark signals.
