DATE/TIME OF REPORT: October 9, 2019, 10:00 A.M.

- According to PG&E, power shutoffs in San Jose are expected to begin by noon on Wednesday, October 9. Areas projected to be affected have not changed; they are East San Jose along the foothills and Almaden in South San Jose.
- The City of San Jose's Emergency Operations Center is activated and the City is implementing its Power Vulnerability Plan to prepare for and respond to the PG&E Power Shutoff.
- The City of San Jose will continue to provide flash report updates at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. throughout the duration of the blackout.
- The next Media Briefing will be held outside the City of San Jose Emergency Operations Center located at 855 N. San Pedro at 3 p.m. today.

- To conserve water at this time, residents and businesses are asked to halt outdoor irrigation.

• PG&E workers are conducting direct outreach to residents in the community. Residents are asked to let the workers do their jobs to contact vulnerable residents and ensure public safety.
