DESCRIPTION/ISSUE

The COVID-19 public health crisis has resulted in the total or partial loss of income for many households. Montgomery County has received additional federal CARES Act Community Development Block Grant-CV (CDBG-CV) funds through the State of Maryland to be used for financial support for County residents facing hardships due to COVID-19.

SUMMARY OF KEY DISCUSSION POINTS

- The County needs additional federal funds to support residents in need of financial assistance because of impacts from COVID-19.
- The County will use these funds for eviction and homelessness prevention programs for people at risk of eviction or homelessness because of COVID-19.

Recently, the Department of Housing and Community Affairs applied for and was awarded competitive Federal funding from the State of Maryland. Through the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the State made available approximately \$15 million in Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) funds. Montgomery County was awarded \$3,473,228. The State (and the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)) requires that this funding be utilized to reduce the negative impact of COVID-19.

This funding will be utilized to provide support for County residents facing housing hardships resulting from the COVID-19 crisis. Specifically, the State requires that funds be used to provide rental assistance to low-income county residents.

I recommend that the County Council approve this special appropriation in the amount of \$3,473,228 and specify the source of funds as Grant Funds. This special appropriation does not impact General Fund Reserves.

I appreciate your prompt consideration of this action.

Background

- 1. Section 308 of the County Charter provides that a special appropriation is an appropriation which states that it is necessary to meet an unforeseen disaster or other emergency, or to act without delay in the public interest. Each special appropriation shall be approved by not less than six Councilmembers. The Council may approve a special appropriation at any time after public notice by news release. Each special appropriation shall specify the source of funds to finance it.
- 2. A new coronavirus disease, named COVID-19, appeared in China in December 2019 and spread extremely quickly. On March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared the disease a pandemic. The March 20, 2020 situation report from the World Health Organization stated that the number of confirmed cases worldwide has exceeded 200,000. It took over three months to reach the first 100,000 confirmed cases, and only 12 days to reach the next 100,000. As of November 10, 2020, there were over 10.2 million confirmed cases in the United States, including 156,000 confirmed cases in Maryland, of which 27,587 were in Montgomery County.
- 3. To slow the spread of the disease, Governor Hogan declared a State of Emergency and has issued several Executive Orders with actions that include, but are not limited to, closing schools, closing senior centers and adult medical day care programs, closing all non-essential businesses and limiting the number of people that can gather.
- 4. This public health crisis has resulted in the immediate loss of income for many households as businesses have been required to close and people have been told to stay home. This creates a financial crisis for many County residents and businesses.

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- 5. The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was passed by Congress with overwhelming, bipartisan support and signed into law by President Trump on March 27, 2020. This over \$2 trillion economic relief package delivers on the Trump Administration's commitment to protecting the American people from the public health and economic impacts of COVID-19.
- 6. The Department of Housing and Community Affairs applied for and was awarded competitive Federal funding from the State of Maryland. Through the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the State made available approximately \$15 million in Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) funds. Montgomery County was awarded \$3,473,228. The State (and the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)) requires that this funding be utilized to reduce the negative impact of COVID-19. Funds will be used to provide financial support for County residents currently facing hardships resulting from the COVID-19 crisis.
- 7. Public notice of the special appropriation was provided by news release and specified the source of funds as Grant Funds.

Action

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following resolution:

A special appropriation to the FY21 Operating Budget of the Montgomery County Government, in the amount of \$3,473,228 is approved as follows:

The funds will be administered by the Department of Health and Human Services to implement an eviction and homeless prevention program addressing tenants who earn up to 60% of Area Medium Income (AMI) that are at risk of eviction or homelessness due to COVID-19 impacts. The application process will coordinate with landlords to facilitate complete application packages and payment of rent arrearage to the landlord on behalf of the tenant.

This special appropriation must be used for financial assistance to County residents facing financial hardship because of the COVID-19 health crisis.

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This appropriation is needed to in response to a public health emergency and to act without delay in the public interest.
