

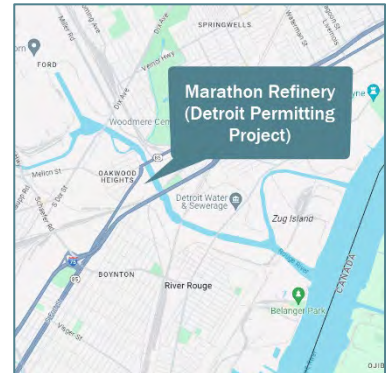
New Source Review Permits Open for Comment

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Marathon – Detroit Permitting Project (multiple applications)

EGLE is holding a public comment period on Marathon’s Detroit Permitting Project, which includes applications for Marathon Petroleum Company LP (Marathon) (APP-2024-0053), Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. (Air Products) (APP-2024-0055), and MPLX Terminals LLC (MPLX) (APP-2024-0054).



The purpose of these permitting actions is to allow Marathon to operate at its physical capacity; add air pollution limits at Marathon and Air Products; implement pollution control projects at Marathon; and increase the height of the vapor recovery unit stack at MPLX. More information about the proposed permits and other supporting documentation can be found on the next page.

The comment period will be open from **April 17 to June 3, 2024**, with a public hearing on **May 22, 2024**. Attend the in-person public meeting and hearing, on May 22, 2024, starting at 5:30 p.m. at the [Kemeny Center, at 2260 South Fort Street, Detroit, Michigan 48217](#). The meeting and hearing will also be broadcast. The public may join the broadcast at: <https://bit.ly/3vtrly7>. EGLE staff will be available to answer questions and provide assistance if needed.

The permit modifications require a revision to the Renewable Operating Permit (ROP) No. [MI-ROP-A9831-2012c \(SRN A9831\)](#). This public comment period meets the public participation requirements for future administrative amendments to the ROP.

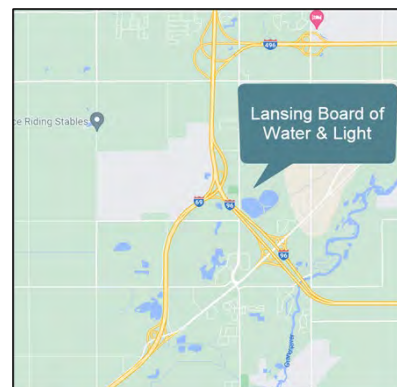

EGLE is holding a public comment period regarding Lansing Board of Water & Light proposed Permit to Install from **March 27** until **May 14, 2024**, with a virtual public hearing if requested on **May 1, 2024**. The company is requesting the installation and operation of a new reciprocating internal combustion engine (RICE) plant.

Types of Documents

Document	Description
Proposed Project Summary	Provides a brief overview of the proposed project.
Technical Fact Sheet	Includes the technical evaluation of the permit application and how the proposed project meets the regulations that apply.
Notice of Hearing	Legal notice for the comment period.
Proposed Permit Terms and Conditions	Includes the proposed permit requirements based on a thorough review of the application.
Interested Party Letter	People who have indicated their interest in this facility are notified comment period has started.
Company Letter	Informs the company the public comment period has started.
