## **MITECS**


Competencies focused on learning enhanced by technology rather than on technology tools. MITECS are aligned to the Top 10 in 10 focus area of Learner-Centered Supports, reflecting a learner-driven approach that empowers students to be active participants in determining their educational pursuits.

#### **Curriculum Standards**

Learning expectations for Michigan's students that are intended to guide curriculum development. Used as a framework, these standards prescribe instructional resources, methods, progressions, and provide a platform for state assessments.

eJournals is a tool on the MeL homepage for searching individual publications by date or by content.


From the MeL Homepage, access **eJournals** from the top bar.




A list of databases that house your publication will appear. Select any of the available databases.






