PURPOSE:

Develop T&E Committee recommendations

On June 26 the County Executive recommended this \$50,000 appropriation for a grant to support the Elderbus service operated by the Jewish Council on Aging (JCA). The Executive's transmittal is on ©1 and a draft adoption resolution is on ©2-3. This resolution would also amend the Non-Competitive Award Status list in the FY20 Operating Budget resolution. The Council's public hearing and action are scheduled for July 30.1

The Elderbus serves the Misler Day Care Center solely and costs \$300,000 to operate annually. Philanthropic contributions are funding half this amount in FY20, the Jewish Federation is providing \$100,000, and this \$50,000 would supply the remaining funds to keep the Elderbus running through next June. (Concurrently JCA is conducting a study to determine whether there should be a different model for providing this service in the future.) Bill 13-18, approved last autumn, allows for funds from the Transportation Services Improvement Fund to be used "to provide incentives or program enhancements to improve or expand transportation options for ... eligible senior citizens" (see ©4-8, especially lines 60-61 and 63 on ©7).

Council staff recommends approval of the resolution on ©2-3.

I am recommending a supplemental appropriation to the FY20 Operating Budget of the Department of Transportation in the amount of \$50,000 for a one-time grant for the Jewish Council for the Aging (JCA) Misler Adult Day Care Center. This appropriation will partially fund the Elderbus transportation service.

This increase is needed to provide support to JCA to provide transportation services to disabled and vulnerable seniors within the County.

I recommend that the County Council approve this supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$50,000 and specify the source of funds as Transportation Services Improvement Fund. This supplemental will reduce the available balance of that fund.

Status

Background

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of five Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- 2. The County Executive has requested the following FY20 Operating Budget appropriation increases for the Department of Transportation:

- 3. The County Executive recommends a supplemental appropriation to the FY20 Operating Budget in the amount of \$50,000 for a one-time grant for the JCA Misler Adult Day Care Center and specifies that the source of funds will be Transportation Services Improvement Fund.
- 4. Section 11B-14 (a) (4) of the Montgomery County Code states that "a contract may be awarded without competition if the Chief Administrative Officer makes a written determination that the contract award serves a public purpose and the proposed contractor has been identified in a grant or appropriation resolution approved by the Council." The result of this action is to amend the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award status resolution to include the entity listed in Section 7.
- 5. The Chief Administrative Officer has determined that funding for contracts with this entity serves a public purpose and that such an expense would be in the public interest.
- 6. The Department of Transportation will fund a contract from the Transportation Services Improvement Fund appropriation for the Jewish Council for the Aging of Greater Washington, Inc. for \$50,000.
- 7. Notice of public hearing was given, and a public hearing was held.


