PURPOSE:

Worksession - Committee to make recommendation on Bill

Expedited Bill 15-19, Contracts and Procurement – Minority Owned Businesses - Sunset Date - Amendments, sponsored by Lead Sponsor Council President Navarro at the request of the County Executive, was introduced on June 18, 2019. A public hearing was held on July 9 at which the lone speaker Ash Shetty testified on behalf of the County Executive. I

Background

Chapter 11B, Article XIV of the County's Procurement Law authorizes a program to remedy the effects of discrimination against certain Minority Owned Businesses that is scheduled to sunset on December 31, 2019. County Code §11B-61(b) states:

By July 1, 2019, the County Executive must submit a report to the County Council evaluating the need to extend the minority owned business purchasing program.

The County Executive submitted a Disparity Study to the Council on July 1, 2014 prepared by Griffin and Strong that supported the continuation of the program and the Council extended the sunset date until December 31, 2019 based on this Disparity Study. The law requires the Executive to submit a report by July 1, 2019 evaluating the need to extend this program. The Executive did not submit a report by July 1 because no updated disparity study has been done since 2014.

Public Hearing

Procurement Director Ash Shetty was the only speaker at the public hearing. Mr. Shetty, speaking on behalf of the Executive, supported the Bill (©8).

Discussion

There is no funding for a disparity study in the FY20 County government approved operating budget. The Executive is unable to evaluate the need to continue the program without an updated disparity study based on more recent contracting data. An updated disparity study is estimated to cost \$600,000 and would require significant time for solicitation and completion of the study.

The Executive submitted Bill 15-19 to the Council to extend the time for the report until July 1, 2021 and the sunset date of the program until December 31, 2021. Bill 15-19 would extend the program for 2 years until the Executive can evaluate the need to continue it. The Executive could submit a supplemental appropriation to the Council to fund an updated disparity study in FY20. **Council staff recommendation:** approve the Bill as introduced.

Testimony on behalf of County Executive Marc Elrich Expedited Bill 15-19, Contracts and Procurement – Minority-owned Business Sunset Date - Amendments

July 9, 2019

Good afternoon, Council President Navarro and Members of the Council.

I am Ash Shetty, Director of the Office of Procurement.

I am here to testify on behalf of County Executive Marc Elrich in support of Expedited Bill 15-19, Contracts and Procurement - Minority Owned Businesses - Sunset Date — Amendments. This bill will extend the sunset provision of the County's MFD program from current sunset date of December 31, 2019 to December 31, 2021.

In 2014, County Executive Leggett transmitted a Disparity Study prepared by the firm of Griffin & Strong, to the County Council. The study revealed under-utilization rates for businesses owned by minorities and women or businesses that employed disabled individuals. The Office of Procurement has set annual MFD goals based on the 2014 Disparity Studies' finding.

Since the last extension of the MFD sunset date, the Office of Procurement has undertaken several actions designed to address issues raised in the 2014 Disparity Study. Even before the MFD Task Force and the Procurement Task Force reports released recommended areas of improvement in September 2015, we had already begun to take action. For instance, in the implementation of Bill 48-14 (MFD Evaluation Criteria Award Points For RFP Solicitations), we have seen increases of MFD participation at the proposal submission phase rather than having to wait till the contract awarding phase; we have re-vamped the MFD waiver policies and criteria; we have conducted many outreach events; and most importantly, we have seen a steady increase of total MFD participation in the last 3 years (20.89% in FY16, 23.24% in FY17 and 23.5% in FY18).

County Executive Elrich has made a clear commitment to expanding County contracting opportunities for MFD, small and local businesses. And I look forward to working with you in the coming year to achieve that goal.

In the upcoming year, I hope that we are able to develop legislative initiatives that permit this county to be a model of procurement reform that encourages economic development and provides meaningful participation for MFD businesses. But the first step of that journey is passage of Expedited Bill 15-19. I urge you to pass this bill.
