The Department of Transportation (DOT) wishes to apply for a COG grant of a \$547,438 to expand its Travel Training Program for seniors and persons with disabilities. The funds would be used to acquire a new Ride On bus specially outfitted to be a classroom setting with monitors, display boards, and handouts.

The grant application would be matched with \$176,682 in County funds. The grant requires a 20% match for capital expenditures and a 50% match for operating costs. If COG were to award the grant to DOT, the funds will not be available until late FY21 or early FY22.

COG requires that a grant application be supported by both the Council and Executive. Council staff recommends authorizing this grant application.

The purpose of this memorandum is to forward to you a request for the County Council's approval of an authorizing resolution for the submission of assistance grant to Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments for the 2019 Enhanced Mobility grant.

This resolution will enable the County to request assistance from Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments for the Travel Training Program. The project will engage partner organizations with a strong local presence and aims to reach groups of various language and cultural backgrounds in five regional centers of the county (Bethesda-Chevy Chase, Eastern Montgomery, Mid County, Silver Spring and UpCounty) as well as the City of Takoma Park. The program aligns with the County's goals of becoming an age-friendly community that is accessible for all. These efforts will directly benefit senior citizens and people with disabilities in the aforementioned areas and subsequently increase the use of public transportation in the County - reducing congestion and pollution, building a healthier community overall.

The Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments requires for a Montgomery County Government Authorizing Resolution to be executed by the County Executive and the County Council President with their witnesses. The approved resolution can be submitted after the grant submission deadline without affecting eligibility.

completion of the five-week training program, new operators are assigned to a depot. As an extension to the training program, the agency utilizes Platform Operator's to mentor and train new operators for an additional two to four-week period. During the mentoring process, the operators receive route and revenue service training. Platform operators receive annual training as a requirement to performing this duty. Follow-up accident and injury training occur when an employee has an accident or is injured on the job. This training is conducted by a qualified Safety and Training Instructor or Transportation Operations Supervisor. Employees that have been away from work for more than thirty days for any reason, and return to work, receive follow-up training. Senior bus operators receive annual safety training.

Montgomery County currently provides a Travel Training program for the senior and disabled communities within the county. The goal is to host up to 50 training programs annually by engaging senior and disability facilities offering the groups with an opportunity to learn more about using public transportation. The Travel Training Workshops are held throughout the County with sites centrally located within the county for ease of access. A typical day of a travel training class would include an overall introduction of transportation terminology. The class will familiarize themselves with bus boarding, learning about the safety and accessibility features of the vehicle. The bus will transport the class to the closest Metro Rail station for a tour of the facility – including guidance on finding information, requesting assistance, and paying fares. The tour will also take attendees through the platform and on the train, where the trainer would point out features of the transit service that are relevant to attendees' needs.

The addition of a dedicated mobile training bus enhances the County's existing program as it expands the geographical area, increases the number of training workshops annually as well as the content of information and further engage partnerships by connecting with agencies amongst the various ethnic groups in the county. The bus will be retrofitted inside to a classroom setting with monitors, displays boards and handouts of the various transportation services offered in the county and the region. Monitors will be used to display video clippings to increase the travel experience. As Montgomery County continues to expand its bikeway program countywide, nearly 100 miles of bike lanes, bike-friendly shoulders and separated bike lanes (cycle tracks); it has become increasingly important to educate the public (seniors and persons with disabilities) on the new road markings and traffic patterns as it relates to pedestrian safety and awareness.



The City of Gaithersburg is pleased to provide this letter of support for the Montgomery County Division of Transit Services' application to the Metropolitan Washington Council of Government's Transportation Planning Board for funding under the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program.

We have a long history of collaboration and partnership with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) and Montgomery County Aging and Disability Services to provide rides to and from the City's Benjamin Gaither Center, which serves our senior population, some of whom have disabilities.

We are aware of the continued and growing need for transportation services and programs for seniors. We currently have nearly 700 members and many of them utilize transportations services provided by the City and the County.
