AN AMENDMENT to the Montgomery County Historic Preservation Ordinance to:

correct technical, typographical, grammatical, reference, and codification errors in, and make stylistic, clarifying, and conforming amendments to, the Historic Resources Preservation Ordinance

By amending the following sections of the Montgomery County Historic Preservation Ordinance, Chapter 24A of the Montgomery County Code:

Section 24A-4.	"Historic preservation commission."
Section 24A-5.	"Same—Powers and duties."

ORDINANCE

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that portion of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Montgomery County, Maryland, approves the following ordinance:

Sec. 1. Section 24A-4 and 24A-5 are amended as follows:

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2 24A-4. Historic [preservation commission] <u>Preservation Commission</u>.

- 3 (a) *Created*. There is [hereby created a commission to be known as the
 4 "historic preservation commission] <u>a Historic Preservation Commission</u>
 5 of Montgomery County, Maryland.["]
- (b) Membership. The [commission shall consist of] Commission has 9 6 members appointed by the [county executive with the confirmation of 7 the county council County Executive and confirmed by the County 8 Council. Each member must be a resident of the [county] County. The 4 9 fields of history, architecture, preservation and urban design [shall] must 10 be represented by a minimum of 1 member qualified by special interest, 11 knowledge, or training. The remaining members of the [commission 12 shall] Commission should, to the extent possible, [be selected to] 13 represent the geographical, social, economic, and cultural concerns of 14 the residents of the [county] County. 15
- Officers. The [county executive shall appoint the chairman and vice-16 (c) chairman of the commission] County Executive must appoint the Chair 17 and Vice-Chair of the Commission, who [shall] serve at [his] the 18 Executive's pleasure, but such appointments occurring after the 19 20 commission's first year of operation shall be made after due consideration has been given to the recommendation of the 21 commission]. The Executive must consider the Commission's 22 recommendation when appointing officers of the Commission. 23
- 24 (d) *Term.* The [terms] term of [the members of the commission shall be for
 25 a three-year period and members shall continue to serve] each member
 26 is 3 years. A member serves until [their successors are] a successor is
 27 appointed and qualified.

- Vacancy. Any vacancy in the membership of the [commission] (e) 28 Commission caused by the expiration of a term, by resignation or death, 29 by a superseding incapacity to discharge duties, by a removal for cause, 30 or by any other cause [creating such vacancy], [shall] must be filled for 31 a new term, or for the remainder of the term for which there is a 32 vacancy as the case may be, in the same manner as provided [herein for 33 the nomination and appointment of the initial members of the 34 35 commission] in paragraph (b).
- 36 (f) *Removal for cause*. [A member may be removed for cause from the
 37 commission by the county executive] <u>The County Executive may</u>
 38 remove a member from the Commission for cause.
- 39 (g) Compensation. [The members of the commission] <u>A member of the</u>
 40 <u>Commission must serve without compensation.</u>
- (h) *Regulations*. The [commission] <u>Commission</u> must adopt, under
 [method] <u>Method</u> (2) of Section 2A-15 [of this Code], rules, guidelines,
 and regulations that are necessary for the proper transaction of the
 business of the [commission] <u>Commission</u>. This includes provisions
 governing contested cases before the [commission] <u>Commission</u>.
- 46 [(1)] (i) *Meetings*. The [commission shall] <u>Commission must hold [such]</u>
 47 regular meetings which, in its discretion, are necessary to [discharge]
 48 <u>perform</u> its duties. Such meetings [shall] <u>must</u> be open to the public.
- I(2)] (j) Staff. [There may be appointed and assigned to the commission such
 employees, and the chief administrative officer shall] <u>The Chief</u>
 <u>Administrative Officer must provide appropriate staff to the</u>
 <u>Commission and make available to the [commission such] Commission</u>
 services and facilities [of the county, as] <u>that</u> are necessary or
 appropriate for the proper performance of its duties[, and the county
