Bill 7-20, Interagency Commission on Homelessness – Membership and Duties <sup>1</sup>

PURPOSE:

SUBJECT:

Introduction - no Council votes required

Council Bill 7-20, Interagency Commission on Homelessness – Membership and Duties, sponsored by Lead Sponsors Councilmembers Glass, Albornoz, and Rice, is scheduled to be introduced on February 25, 2020. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for March 17 at 1:30 p.m.

Bill 7-20 would alter the membership and duties of the Interagency Commission on Homelessness.

#### BACKGROUND

The Interagency Commission on Homelessness (ICH) is a 25-member commission created by the County Council in 2014 to coordinate public and private programs to reduce homelessness in the County.

The ICH has requested that several modifications and updates be made to its membership and duties. The purpose of these amendments is to improve the governance and effectiveness of the ICH, as well as to clarify the mission of the ICH to "end and prevent" homelessness, as opposed to simply "reducing" homelessness.

#### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Under Bill 7-20, the ICH would remain a 25-member commission, but its composition would change. At the request of the ICH, certain ex officio slots would be replaced with more public representatives, including homeless service providers, healthcare providers, family services providers, and affordable housing providers.

Regarding operations of the ICH, the bill would require the ICH to maintain a governance committee co-chaired by the ICH Chair and the Chief of Services to End and Prevent Homelessness of the Department of Health and Human Services. The bill also would clarify that a majority of the ICH constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

Importantly, the bill would update certain policy approaches of the ICH. In particular, it would provide that the ICH's purpose is to end and prevent homelessness (i.e., bring homelessness to functional zero), rather than simply reducing homelessness. It also would explicitly prioritize finding permanent housing for homeless individuals and valuing client choice.
