COUNCIL DECISION POINTS & COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

- The <u>Government Operations & Fiscal Policy Committee (GO) held a worksession</u> on March 5, 2020 and recommends approval (2-0; Councilmember Friedson absent).
- The supplemental was <u>Introduced at the February 25, 2020 session</u>. Due to scheduling conflicts and the timing of the Census 2020 launch, the GO Committee worksession was scheduled prior to the public hearing and action.
- The GO Committee requested a written response from the County Executive to address any gaps in capacity or funding to provide inclusive census outreach and materials to a specific geography, language or target population. No update is available at the time of this report.

DESCRIPTION/ISSUE

Additional appropriation to the FY20 Operating Budget in the amount of \$581,700 is needed for the Census 2020 Grant Program to the Community Engagement Cluster, Office of Community Partnerships. The source of funds is a State of Maryland grant.

Background

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of five Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- The County Executive has requested the following FY20 Operating Budget appropriation increases for the Community Engagement Cluster, Office of Community Partnerships (OCP):

- 3. This increase is needed because the OCP was awarded funds through the Maryland State 2020 Census Grant Program to implement 2020 Census activities through June 30, 2020. The Census Grant Program will be utilized to implement "Everyone Counts in Montgomery County," a countywide education and outreach strategy in partnership with nonprofit organizations and stakeholders to ensure that everyone is counted with a special focus on "hard-to-count communities."
- 4. The County Executive recommends a supplemental appropriation to the FY20 Operating Budget in the amount of \$581,700 for the 2020 Census Grant Program and specifies that the source of funds will be Grant Fund.
- 5. Notice of public hearing was given, and a public hearing was held.
