# **COUNCIL DECISION POINTS & COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION**

- On June 11, 2020, the Education and Culture and Health and Human Services Committees recommended (6-0) to increase overall funding for arts capital projects and defer funding over three fiscal years to arts and humanities organizations.
- Joint committee recommended fiscal actions for FY21 are \$746,638, a \$250,000 increase over the CE FY21 recommended amount and for FY22 and FY23, \$603,412 and \$250,000, respectively.

# **DESCRIPTION/ISSUE**

- The Council introduced this CIP amendment and special appropriation on July 14, 2020.
- During the County Council Operating Budget worksession on May 13, the Council approved by straw vote (9-0), to amend the Cost Sharing: Montgomery County Government (MCG) recommendation and defer the discussion on capital grants to arts and humanities organizations to the Education and Culture and Health and Human Services Committees, jointly with Office of Management and Budget, Department of General Services and the Arts & Humanities Council.
- On May 17, the Office of Management and Budget set aside \$496,638 to fund CIP grants for arts and humanities organizations to be discussed at a future joint committee worksession.

### **Background**

- 1. Section 308 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that a special appropriation: (a) may be made at any time after public notice by news release; (b) must state that the special appropriation is necessary to meet an unforeseen disaster or other emergency or to act without delay in the public interest; (c) must specify the revenues necessary to finance it; and (d) must be approved by no fewer than six members of the Council.
- 2. Section 302 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that the Council may amend an approved capital improvements program at any time by an affirmative vote of no fewer than six members of the Council.
- 3. The County Council recommends the following capital project appropriation increases:

- 4. During the County Council Operating Budget worksession on May 13, the Council approved to amend the Cost Sharing: Montgomery County Government (MCG) recommendation and defer the discussion on capital grants to arts and humanities organizations to the Education and Culture and Health and Human Services Committees on June 11, jointly with Office of Management Budget, Department of General Services and the Arts & Humanities Council.
- 5. The Education and Culture and Health and Human Services Committees recommend an amendment to the FY21-26 Capital Improvements Program and a special appropriation in the amount of \$250,000 for Cost Sharing: MCG (P720601) and specifies that the source of funds will be Current Revenue.

6. Public notice of this special appropriation and amendment was provided and a public hearing was held.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project provides funds for the development of non-governmental projects in conjunction with public agencies or the private sector. County participation leverages private and other public funds for these facilities. Prior to disbursing funds, the relevant County department or agency and the private organization will develop a Memorandum of Understanding, which specifies the requirements and responsibilities of each.

#### COST CHANGE

Cost increase due to the addition of funding in FY25 and FY26 and the addition of FY21 Community Grants and Grants for Arts and Humanities Organizations.

Approved FY18 Supplemental 15-S18-CMCG-13 added \$100,000 in State Aid to recognize FY15 State Bond Bill. Amended project approved in FY18 designated a total of \$300,365 of the \$400,000 project balance to 32 individual faith-based organizations, leaving a remaining unallocated balance of \$99,635 in the project for emergency capital grants. Approved FY19 Supplemental 3-S19-CMCG-3 added \$400,000 in Current Revenue for Manna Food Center, Inc. and

A pedestrian impact analysis will be performed during design or is in progress. Expenditures will continue indefinitely.
