DESCRIPTION/ISSUE

The County Council will receive testimony and consider action on a supplemental appropriation to the FY21 Operating Budget, Montgomery County Public Schools, \$13,241,438 for the Tutoring Program Grant. The source of funds is the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act-Coronavirus Relief Fund.

SUMMARY OF KEY DISCUSSION POINTS

- The Board of Education requested this appropriation on August 25. The County Executive recommended approval on September 8. The Council introduced this appropriation on September 15.
- This supplemental appropriation is needed because MCPS received funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund-Maryland Local School System: Tutoring Grant.
- MCPS plans to use these grant funds for online tutoring opportunities for MCPS elementary, middle, and high school students to recover reading and mathematics skill deficiencies from the lack of direct instruction due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

SUBJECT: Supplemental Appropriation #21-488 to the FY21 Operating Budget Montgomery County Public Schools CARES Act - Coronavirus Relief Fund - Tutoring Program Grant, \$13,241,438

I am recommending a supplemental appropriation to the FY21 Operating Budget of Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) in the amount of \$13,241,438 for the CARES Act's Coronavirus Relief Fund's Tutoring Program Grant. This appropriation will provide funds for MCPS to implement a district-wide tutoring program to increase student engagement, addressing the loss of in-class learning, and help students meet educational attainment standards.

This supplemental appropriation is needed to provide spending authority for grant funds received from the CARES Act's Coronavirus Relief Fund's Tutoring Program Grant. As a grant award, there is no effect on the County's current or future maintenance of effort requirements.

I recommend that the County Council approve this supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$13,241,438 and specify the source of funds as Federal Funds.

SUBJECT: Supplemental Appropriation #21-488 to the FY21 Operating Budget Montgomery County Public Schools CARES Act – Coronavirus Relief Fund – Tutoring Program Grant, \$13,241,438

Background

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of five Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- 2. The County Executive has requested the following FY21 Operating Budget appropriation increases for Montgomery County Public Schools:

- 3. This increase is needed to provide spending authority for the use of grant funds received from the CARES Act's Coronavirus Relief Fund's Tutoring Program Grant. As a grant award, there is no effect on the County's current or future maintenance of effort requirements.
- 4. The County Executive recommends a supplemental appropriation to the FY21 Operating Budget in the amount of \$13,241,438 for the CARES Act's Coronavirus Relief Fund's Tutoring Program Grant and specifies that the source of funds will be Federal Funds.

Subject: Recommended Fiscal Year 2021 Supplemental Appropriation for the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security Act – Coronavirus Relief Fund – Tutoring Program Grant

Recommendation in Brief

Authorization is requested to receive and expend, subject to County Council approval, a Fiscal Year 2021 supplemental appropriation of \$13,241,438 from the *Coronavirus Aid Relief* and *Economic Security Act* (CARES) – Coronavirus Relief Fund – Tutoring Program grant. This grant was included in the CARES Act that was signed into law on March 27, 2020. Under this Act, the U. S. Department of the Treasury has provided the states with the emergency relief funds to address the impact that the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on states and localities across the nation.

Background

The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic has had a major impact on Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) and its ability to provide teaching and learning to its students. As a result of the pandemic and in compliance with Governor Lawrence J. Hogan Jr. and Maryland State Superintendent of Schools Karen B. Salmon's direction, MCPS closed its school buildings beginning March 16, 2020, and did not reopen buildings for the remainder of the 2019–2020 school year. MCPS instituted a Continuity of Learning plan that relied on distance learning for the remainder of the school year, summer school, and the start of the 2020–2021 school year.

Section 5001 of the CARES Act established the Coronavirus Relief Fund to make payments for specific uses to states as a result of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). Local school systems may use funds to implement a tutoring program that meets certain criteria to compensate for the learning loss associated with time away from direct instruction as a result of the school closures due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Support of Board of Education Mission

MCPS will use CARES Act – Coronavirus Relief Fund – Tutoring Program grant funds to implement a districtwide tutoring program. As a result of the evolving circumstances associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, MCPS elementary, middle, and high schools will offer tutoring opportunities in an online model. The goal of the tutoring program will be to maximize student engagement, address learning recovery, and accelerate learning to achieve grade-level standards. The lack of direct instruction in reading and mathematics for the last four months due to the COVID-19 pandemic creates a critical need to support students who have deficiencies in those skills. Research has shown that the rate of learning gain can be improved with intensive tutoring will decrease the learning gap.

Use of Funds

Funds will be used to provide for:

- Non-position instructional salaries;
- Instructional materials;
- Special education non-position instructional salaries;
- Equitable services for non-publics; and
- Associated employee benefits.

Recommended Resolution

WHEREAS, Montgomery County Public Schools has received notification from the Maryland State Department of Education that it will receive \$13,241,438 for the Maryland Local School System: Tutoring Program grant funded through the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act*; now therefore be it

<u>Resolved</u>, That the superintendent of schools be authorized to receive and expend, subject to County Council approval, a Fiscal Year 2021 supplemental appropriation of \$13,241,438 for the CARES Act – Coronavirus Relief Fund – Maryland Local School System: Tutoring Program grant in the following categories:
